WHAT IS EBAY FOR CHARITY?

eBay for Charity enables members of the eBay community to connect with and support their favorite charities when they buy or sell in the U.S. and abroad. Every time a community member buys or sells on eBay, it's an opportunity to support causes that matter the most and to help with their fundraising goals.

With more than 183 million active buyers globally and over 83,000 charities enrolled on the site, eBay is home to one of the world's largest and most active giving communities. Since 2003, the eBay community has raised more than \$1 billion for charities around the world, with \$102 million raised in 2018 alone.





HOW DOES IT WORK?

BUYING • SELLING • FUNDRAISING



Buying for charity

Anyone shopping on eBay can choose to shop for items that directly benefit their favorite charities or to add donations at checkout. The eBay for Charity ribbon next to the listing, indicates that the listing will benefit charity. Buyers can also add a \$1 to \$25 donation to their favorite charity during checkout.



Selling for charity

Any eBay seller can choose to donate a percentage of a sale to their favorite charity. Sellers can donate 10% - 100% of an item's final sale price to a charity that is on the eBay platform. For those sellers, eBay credits the insertion and final value fee, equal to the percentage elected to donate.



Charities on eBay

Charities enroll on eBay so people can choose to support them every time they buy or sell on eBay and to ultimately help with their fundraising goals. Charities with access to inventory can also sell directly to the active buying community on eBay and all seller fees are waived.

HOW DO THE FUNDS GET TO THE CHARITY?

The money collected from sales and check-out donations are collected by our partner, PayPal Giving Fund (PPGF). PPGF then sends the donations to the charity's PayPal account once a month. Charities selling directly on eBay receive the funds directly into their PayPal accounts, similarly to our regular eBay sellers.































HOW TO SUPPORT CHARITIES WHEN YOU BUY

Anyone can help support charities when they shop on eBay.

When using PayPal as the payment option at checkout, buyers on eBay can elect to donate \$1.00 - \$25.00 to any participating charity.






HOW TO SUPPORT CHARITIES WHEN YOU SELL

Depending on the type of seller you are, the donation module may be in a different location. For any issues with listing for charity, contact us at charityteam@ebay.com.

- Create a listing on eBay
 - In the selling flow, look for our charity ribbon and check the box that says "Donate a portion to charity" or "Make a donation"
 - Select the percentage you want to donate
 - Select the charity you want to donate to
 - List the item!

 The donation will be calculated for you once the item is sold. All you have you to think about is packing and shipping your item!



SELLING FOR CHARITY HAS MANY BENEFITS



Once the item is sold, sellers receive insertion and final value fee credits to the extent they donate (ie. 10% credit for 10% donation)



Sellers donating as little as 10% to charity could see listings sell faster and for higher prices



Sellers receive the tax deduction because donations they make go to registered 501(c)3s
